1. The applicant or applicant's family must be a current regular or associate member of the Campbell County Farm Bureau Federation.
2. The applicant must either have a High School Diploma or GED or be in the current graduating class.
3. The applicant must have at least a 3.0 scholastic grade point average based upon a 4.0 scale.
4. The applicant must be enrolled at a Wyoming Community College, the University of Wyoming, or at a Wyoming technical school at the time the scholarship funds are granted.

The Clifford P. Hansen Memorial Scholarship **Deadline March 15th**



To be eligible, students, parents, and/or guardians must be a member in good standing of WSGA. The applicants must be a sophomore, junior, or senior for the upcoming Fall semester, or a senior who is graduating and has been accepted into graduate school for the concurrent semester. The students must be enrolled full-time at the University of Wyoming or a Wyoming Community College, have a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher, and be majoring in agriculture or a natural resource related field. The winners will be approved by the WSGA trustees based on recommendation from the WSGA Executive Committee. The scholarship winners will be announced at the Wyoming Cattle Industry Convention & Trade Show. Winners will be notified prior and invited to attend to be recognized in front of WSGA membership and supporters.

To apply for this scholarship, the applicant must submit an official transcript and essay of 500 words or less addressing the following questions:

- What have you gained from your college experience?
- What leadership roles have you acquired since starting college and how have those leadership roles influenced you?
- How do your post-college plans involve agriculture or natural resources?
- What characteristics distinguish you as deserving this scholarship?

RMACAC **Deadline February 27th**



The mission of RMACAC is to support and advance the work of counselors as they help students realize their full educational potential, with particular emphasis on the transition from secondary schools to colleges and universities and with attention to access and equity, including college readiness, for all students.

RMACAC is excited to once again offer three (3) \$1,000 scholarships to students in each of our member states; Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming, for a total of \$15,000 in award monies. We have tried to keep these applications and supplementary materials as concise and simple as possible. This scholarship is awarded to students who live in one of the member states, attend a public or private high school in one of the member states, is in their final year of high school, and will be attending a regionally accredited college or university beginning the Summer or Fall term.

This scholarship also requires that interested students be nominated by a current paid member of RMACAC by the date of the close of the application. If your counselor is not already a member, they can still join by going to <https://rmacac.org/membership/>. Your application will not be considered if your nominator is not a member of RMACAC.

The Hawthorn Foundation

Applications for the fall term will only be accepted June 1 through July 31, and applications for the spring term will only be accepted October 1 through November 30. Applications submitted outside of these dates will not be considered.



*The Hawthorn Foundation administers a **Scholarship Fund** that provides grants to Wyoming individuals to enable them to complete a high school, undergraduate, graduate or technical school education in the field of their choice at any accredited school they may choose that is in the United States.*

To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants must reside in Wyoming and plan to attend on a full-time basis a fully accredited educational institution in the United States. Applicants must submit with their application: (i) a detailed plan outlining how they propose to use scholarship funds, including the name of the educational institution they wish to attend, the tuition, fees and other expenses that would be required for attendance, the duration and location of the program, and the degree or certification they hope to obtain (an “Education Plan”); and (ii) a description of how pursuing the contemplated course of study would improve his or her life circumstances (a “Personal Essay”). **HAWTHORN FOUNDATION ONLY COVERS TUITION, FEES AND BOOKS.** Applicants need not be traditional students who are generally eligible for scholarship aid from a variety of other sources. Rather, they may be non-traditional students, such as:

- Individuals whose needs are not being met at their public high schools and need to attend a private or alternative high school;
- individuals who received a General Equivalency Degree (“GED”) instead of a high school diploma;
- individuals who did not finish high school and have not obtained a GED but would like to obtain a GED and/or pursue an education at a technical or vocational school that can teach them a valuable skill for earning a living;
- low-income adults who are returning to school, or are starting a higher education for the first time;
- low-income individuals who will be the first in their family to attend college;
- individuals who are striving to overcome obstacles in their lives (e.g., foster care system, homelessness) and are looking to make a fresh start through education; or
- returning military.

Scottish Rite Foundation of Wyoming **Deadline June 1st**

The Wyoming Scottish Rite Foundation is an incorporated non-profit organization of the Masonic Fraternity dedicated to charitable and educational purposes.

Eligibility

1. Scholarship applicants must be graduates of a Wyoming high school or hold a Wyoming GED.

2. The recipients must be full-time students during the year the scholarship is used.

Completion of a full course load with a minimum GPA of 2.5 is required for the first semester to receive the scholarship the second (spring) semester.

Powder River Energy Corporation- Feb 27th

PRECorp Scholarship - In 2026, Powder River Energy Corporation will award scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each to 19 qualifying graduates from high schools in its service territory. The Powder River Energy Foundation Board of Directors selects the recipients.

To be eligible the applicant's parents or legal guardians must be members of, and receive electric service from Powder River Energy. The applicant must be a student who is enrolled, or plans to enroll, in an accredited two-year college, four-year college or vocational technical school.

Rising Opportunity Student Scholarship (ROSS)- The Powder River Energy Foundation manages the Rising Opportunity Student Scholarship (R.O.S.S.) program. The Foundation will award up to four \$2,000 scholarships for students entering tuition-based training, certification, and degree programs.

The program is made possible by a fund established by Campbell County native Perry Ross. Mr. Ross retired from business with a substantial living trust and has established an educational scholarship program to help others succeed in life.

- Applicants must provide the following:
 - Other scholarships they are receiving and/or applying for.
 - Number of dependents in the home and/or school age children.
 - Short essay on career aspirations and educational objectives.
 - Information on personal needs and challenges in seeking higher education.
 - List of activities applicant has participated in i.e., work experience, community involvement, etc.
 - Letters of reference.
- Applicants can be any age (not necessarily recent high school graduates or full-time college students). Adults who are entering a tuition-based education program are eligible to apply.
- While high academic scores are welcome, applicants who are solid students, hard workers, and dedicated to their success are preferred candidates.
- Preferred applicants should reside in Campbell, Crook, Johnson, Sheridan, or Weston counties. They need not be a PRECorp member to receive a R.O.S.S.
- Students awarded scholarships may change educational institutions in pursuit of their career objectives without jeopardizing their scholarship funding.



Successful recipients of R.O.S.S. program scholarships are encouraged to apply each year provided they are in good academic standing and are continuing to pursue their educational objectives.

[Basin Electric Power Cooperative Scholarship-](#)

Basin Electric Power Cooperative will award scholarships in the amount of \$2,500. Up to three students from the PRECorp membership service territory may be chosen. The filing deadline for the Basin Electric Power Scholarship is January 30, 2026. To apply students must satisfy the required criteria and complete the scholarship application, which can be obtained from area high school guidance offices or directly from PRECorp business offices.

Eligibility, Application, and Selection Process:

- Available to graduates and graduating seniors planning to attend college the following fall.
- Full-time Enrollment into a diesel technician program will be required.
- Scholarship recipients must maintain a grade point average required to remain in good standing in the school in which they are enrolled.
- High school applicants are required to attach a copy of their official ACT/SAT scores and their current high school transcript to the online application
- The scholarship will be rescinded and awarded to a designated alternate if the recipient does not enroll as a full-time student for the first semester for which the scholarship is awarded.

Applicants must provide a short essay relating to goals, training path or plan, future employment interests and 3 letters of recommendation within the digital application.

Online applications must be submitted to the Oregon Trail Community Foundation by April 1st. All applications will be reviewed by the OTCF Scholarship Committee, with the finalists forwarded on to the Floyd's Truck Center, Inc. Scholarship Committee.

The "Ernest Swinney Master Mechanic Scholarship"

Offered to those individuals who are 18 years of age or older, have graduated or will graduate from an accredited high school, and possess adequate practical experience and /or formal training to meet institutional prerequisites and demonstrate sincerity.

This award may be used at any nationally accredited institution that is offering a degree or diploma in mining related technical, maintenance or field mechanics.

The recipient of this award will be required to verify their pursuit in mining related technical, maintenance, or field mechanics. Maintain no less than a 2.0 on a 4.0 scale or C grade average. Scholastic standing to be reported to committee chairperson on a semesterly basis and conform to the governing rules and regulations of the institution. Noncompliance to any or all of the above requirements will constitute loss of future awards.
